








































FEEDBACK FROM FACULTY MEMBERS ON VARIOUS ASPECTS:










































FEEDBACK FROM FACULTY MEMBERS ON VARIOUS ASPECTS:



Analysis of Feedback:

Faculty feedback on course content indicates strong satisfaction with practical components and employable skills, but concerns exist regarding creative skills and ethical/environmental standards. Teaching facilities generally received positive ratings for ICT integration and student response, though feasibility in subjects and expertise recognition were noted as areas needing improvement. Research ambience showed mixed results with varying levels of motivation and financial assistance. Co-curricular activities highlighted a need for more freedom in design and support across all categories. Basic amenities such as cleanliness and green environment received mixed feedback, suggesting targeted improvements are necessary.

Recommendations:

- Course Content: Emphasise on creative skills and ethical/environmental aspects with the university designed C.B.C.S syllabus.
- Teaching Facilities: Improve expertise recognition of teachers. Continue to enhance ICT integration in teaching-learning process.
- Research Ambience: Increase motivation for research across all disciplines. Provide more financial assistance and promote access to reputable research journals.
- Co-curricular Activities: Increase opportunities for designing activities and enhance support in materials and parental involvement.
- Basic Amenities: Focus on improving cleanliness standards, green environment initiatives, and the variety/quality of canteen offerings. Ensure reliable and efficient transport services and maintain high standards of drinking water provision.















































Analysis of the Feedback of faculty Members on CBCS Curriculum:

The feedback on CBCS courses by faculty members shows significant variability in perceptions across several aspects, including societal requirements, practical components, employable skills, creative skills, course design freedom, needs catering, library resources, ethical and environmental standards, and overall course effectiveness. Scores range from 1 to 22, highlighting a wide disparity in satisfaction levels. While some respondents rate aspects like employability and practical components highly, others indicate significant areas needing improvement, particularly in fostering creativity, improving library resources, and integrating ethical and environmental standards. The consistent high scores from one respondent suggest a generally positive perception, yet the overall variability points to inconsistencies in how the courses meet student expectations. This feedback underscores the need for a closer examination of these aspects to ensure a more uniformly positive educational experience, aligning better with the diverse needs and expectations of all students.

Recommendations:

- 1.. The curriculum should be strengthened to better prepare students with employable skills.
- 2. More creative elements should be introduced in the courses to engage students better.
- 3. The library and e-resources should be improved to meet student needs more effectively.
- The ethical and environmental aspects should be robustly incorporated into the curriculum and the teaching-learning process.

FEEDBACK OF THE FACULTY MEMBERS ON THE TEACHING-LEARNING PROCESS:

Analysis:

The feedback on the teaching-learning process highlights varied perceptions across ten dimensions: ICT, student response, feasibility in subjects, expertise recognition, motivation to research, research journals, financial assistance, paper presentation/publication, FDPs, and seminar/conference/workshop conduct. Ratings span from "Excellent" to "Poor," with ICT and student response receiving the highest marks in the "Good" category (12 and 6, respectively), indicating effective use of technology and satisfactory student engagement. However, areas like financial assistance and research motivation show lower scores, particularly in the "Poor" category, revealing gaps in support for research activities. Expertise recognition and feasibility in subjects score moderately, suggesting room for improvement in curriculum design and



faculty development. The conduct of seminars, conferences, and workshops also shows variability, with higher ratings in "Good" and "Satisfactory" but notable dissatisfaction. Overall, the process demonstrates strengths in ICT and student response but needs enhancement in research support and faculty development programs to foster a more comprehensive educational experience.

Recommendations:

- Support for the faculty engaged in research activities should be increased to improve motivation and enable more substantial research output. This can include offering grants, facilitating access to high-quality research journals, and creating more researchoriented programs.
- More Faculty Development Programs (FDPs) should be organised to ensure faculty members have the latest knowledge and skills. This will help in better curriculum delivery and keeping up with contemporary teaching methods.
- More workshops, National/ International level seminars, and conferences should be organised so that the faculty has access to the latest trends and technologies. This will keep them abreast of the times.
- Course content should be aligned more closely with current standards in the job market and student career aspirations.

FEEDBACK OF THE FACULTY MEMBERS ON THE INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES IN THE COLLEGE:

Analysis: The analysis of infrastructural facilities and college environment at Dewanhat Mahavidyalaya based on various criteria reveals mixed perceptions among the faculty members. Key aspects include freedom to design, encouragement, materials support, parent and teacher relationships, and environmental factors like cleanliness and green surroundings. While teacher-student relationships and encouragement receive high ratings in the "Excellent" and "Good" categories, other critical areas such as restroom cleanliness and green environment fall short, rating lower in "Satisfactory" or even "Poor." This suggests a need for focused

improvements in maintaining cleanliness, enhancing green initiatives, and providing better support for research activities. Strengthening coordination and cooperation among stakeholders, including parents and teachers, is also crucial. Addressing these issues comprehensively will contribute to a more conducive learning environment, fostering both academic excellence and holistic development at Dewanhat Mahavidyalaya.

Recommendations:

- Cleanliness standards should be improved throughout the campus.
- Support for research materials and resources should be enhanced and teaching-learning process should be enhanced.
- 3. A green environment on campus should be developed and maintained.
- 4. Facilities like restrooms, canteen, and drinking water provisions should be improved.
- 5. Improve library resources and teach university curriculum in a more engaging manner
















































FEEDBACK FROM FACULTY MEMBERS ON VARIOUS ASPECTS:



Analysis:

Course Content: Feedback on course content highlights strengths in practical components, employable skills, and catering to societal requirements. However, there are concerns regarding creative skills development and freedom to design courses, which need improvement. The implementation of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) received mixed feedback, indicating areas for enhancement in flexibility and student-centric learning.

Teaching Facilities: The availability of ICT resources and student response to teaching are generally satisfactory. However, expertise recognition and subject feasibility require attention to ensure optimal teaching quality across all disciplines.

Research Ambience: While there is motivation for research among faculty, access to research journals and financial assistance could be improved to foster a more robust research environment.

Seminars/Conferences/Workshops/FDP: The participation and publication rates in seminars, conferences, workshops, and Faculty Development Programs (FDPs) show strong engagement. However, efforts are needed to increase the frequency and diversity of such events to enhance professional development.

Co-curricular Activities: There is moderate satisfaction with the freedom to design and support for co-curricular activities. However, there are opportunities to increase material support and parental involvement to enrich student experiences beyond academics.

Teacher-Student, Teacher-Parent Relationship: Positive feedback on teacher-student relationships and coordination/cooperation indicates a supportive academic atmosphere. Efforts to further motivate research and strengthen relationships with parents as 'second parents' are recommended.

Basic Amenities: While basic amenities such as restrooms and drinking water are generally satisfactory, cleanliness and green environment initiatives need improvement. The canteen and transport services require attention to meet diverse needs effectively.

Recommendations:

- Strengthen ICT infrastructure and expertise recognition in teaching facilities.
- 2. Improve access to research journals and financial support for research activities and introduce grants for research projects.
- 3. Increase the frequency and diversity of seminars, conferences, workshops, and FDPs.
- 4. Establish computer lab with enough computers.
- Boost material support and parental involvement in co-curricular activities.
- Focus on cleanliness and sustainability efforts for a healthier campus environment.
